**A BILL**

To direct the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration to issue regulations to include strollers in the contract of carriage of air carriers and set a liability limit for damaged strollers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CONTRACT OF CARRIAGE OF STROLLERS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than [ \_\_\_\_\_ ]  
5 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator  
6 of the Federal Aviation Administration shall issue such  
7 regulations as are necessary to amend part 253 of title

1 14, Code of Federal Regulations, to require all air carriers  
2 to—

3 (1) include strollers in the contract of carriage  
4 of such airline; and

5 (2) to tag any stroller with a denotation that  
6 such stroller shall be handled with care.

7 (b) CONSISTENCY.—In carrying out subsection (a),  
8 the Administrator shall ensure that any update to the con-  
9 tract of carriage under such subsection shall be consistent  
10 with the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules  
11 for International Carriage by Air (typically referred to as  
12 the “Montreal Convention”).

13 (c) LIMITS ON BAGGAGE LIABILITY.—Not later than  
14 \_\_\_\_\_ after the date of enactment of this Act, the Ad-  
15 ministrator shall issue such regulations as are necessary  
16 to amend section 254.4 of title 14, Code of Federal Regu-  
17 lations, to set a liability amount for damage to a stroller  
18 by an air carrier of \$2,175, within the liability limit for  
19 all baggage under such section.

20 (d) STROLLER DEFINED.—In this section, the term  
21 “stroller”—

22 (1) means a collapsible carriage designed as a  
23 chair in which a small child may be pushed; and

24 (2) includes any other device used to hold chil-  
25 dren on the move.
